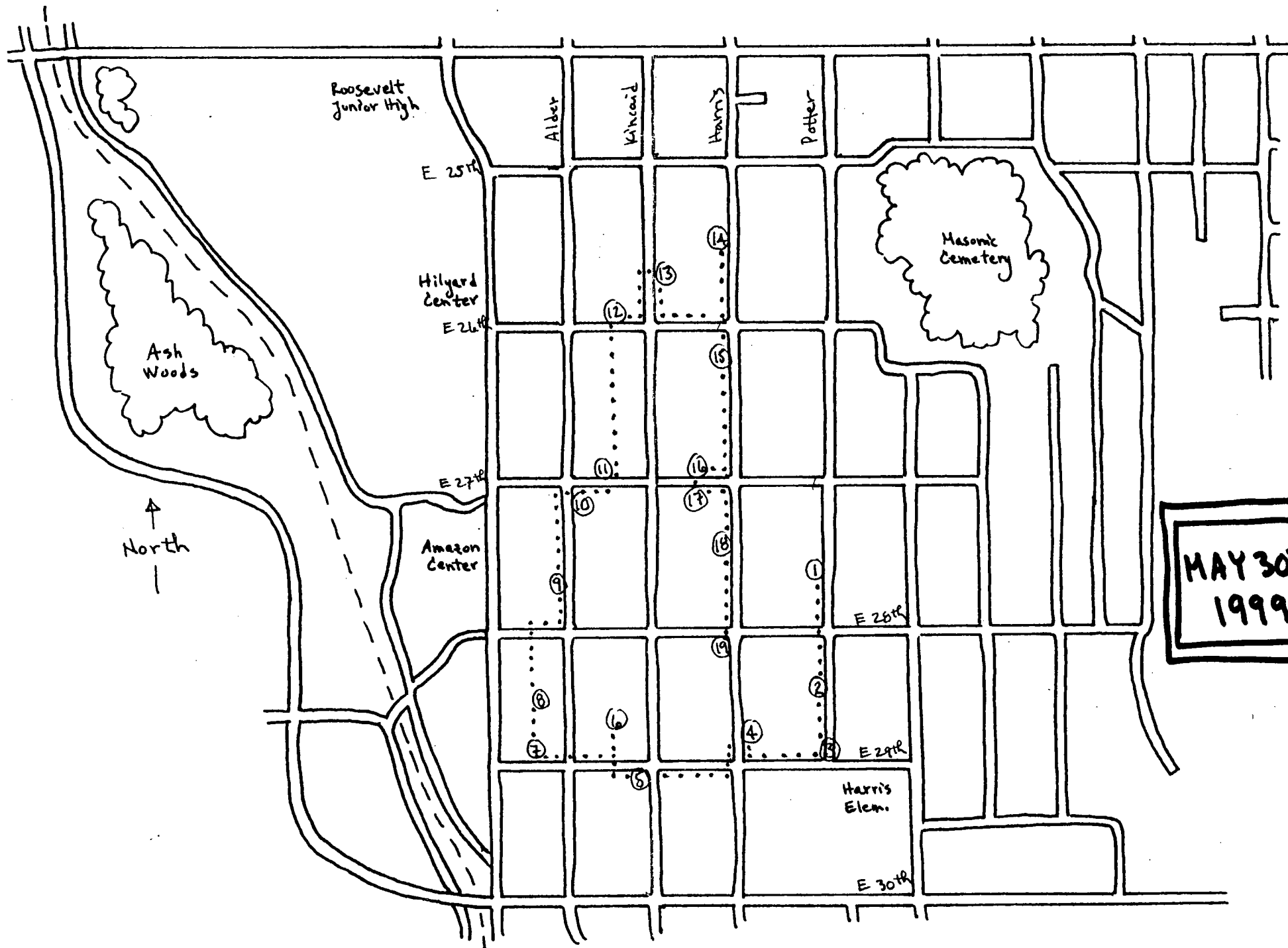
## BROADLEAF TREES

1. silver maple (*Acer saccharinum*)
2. European white birch (*Betula pendula*)
3. kousa or Chinese dogwood (*Cornus kousa*)  
one-seeded hawthorn (*Crataegus monogyna*)
4. wildlife habitat...!  
columnar Europ. white birch (*Betula pendula* 'Fastigiata')
5. Siberian elm (*Ulmus pumila*)
6. London planetree (*Platanus x acerifolia*)
7. Oregon ash (*Fraxinus latifolia*)  
'Sunburst' honey locust (*Gleditsia triacanthos* 'Sunburst')
8. striped maple (*Acer* sp.)
9. purple-leaved flowering plum (*Prunus cerasifera* 'Atro-purpurea')
10. sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*)
11. field maple (*Acer campestre*)
12. American elm (*Ulmus americana*)
13. southern beech (*Nothofagus antarctica*)
14. black locust (*Robinia pseudoacacia*)  
big leaf maple languishing... (*Acer macrophyllum*)
15. European white poplar (*Populus alba*)
16. pin oak (*Quercus palustris*)
17. "common" persimmon (*Diospyros virginiana*)  
'Paul's Scarlet' English hawthorn (*Crataegus laevigata* 'Paul's Scarlet')
18. variegated boxelder (*Acer negundo* 'Variegata')
19. Trees for the future!

northern catalpa (*Catalpa speciosa*)  
goldenrain tree (*Koelreuteria paniculata*)  
lacebark elm (*Ulmus parvifolia*)

Remember to keep all grass at least two feet away from the trunks of new trees for at least three years!
